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Letter From the YLN Administrator

Dear Stakeholders and Friends.

As we reflect on the past year, we are filled with gratitude and pride for the remarkable achievements and milestones we have reached together. This year, we have made significant strides in expanding our services and resources to better serve our libraries and community members. Some of our key accomplishments include:

- ILS Migration: The Yavapai Library Network (YLN) transitioned from SirsiDynix to Koha, an open-source integrated library system (ILS) managed by ByWater Solutions. This change was initiated by Valerie Burns in the summer of 2022. A committee of experts identified specifications and evaluated vendor bids, leading to the selection of ByWater in September 2023. The migration began in mid-December, with a 6-month timeline to transition all 59 libraries. An Implementation Committee assisted with policy decisions, coordination, and marketing. Training was provided to 292 staff members on-site and 75 via webinars. The new Koha ILS went live on June 17th. Special thanks are given to all participants in the process.
- Authority Control: With the support of an LSTA grant, our shared catalog's bibliographic and authority files were upgraded to RDA standards. This included enhancements to subject headings, authority control, tables of contents, and reading levels, all completed before the ILS migration. The project was funded by the Arizona State Library, Archives & Public Records, a division of the Secretary of State, using federal funds from the Institute of Museum and Library Services.
- New YLN Member: In October 2023, Cañon Elementary School in Black Canyon City became the 29th school library to join the YLN. The library brought over 4,000 items and a strong enthusiasm for participating in our Network.

Changes in our Libraries:

- Several libraries saw a change in leadership as several directors retired or moved on to new
 opportunities. This includes the retirement of long-time directors Roger Saft of Prescott Public
 Library, Scott Bruner of Chino Valley Public Library, as well as Andrew Barber's move from Prescott
 College Library to Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University.
- This was a transition year for Yavapai College as both libraries began transitioning to Centers for Learning and Innovation. Once completed, the facilities will feature immersive learning experiences in addition to the more traditional library resources.

Looking Ahead:

In the coming year, we plan to revisit the YLN Strategic Plan and Technology Plan. As we move forward, we remain committed to our mission of connecting people with the information, resources, and opportunities they need to thrive.

About the YLN

The Yavapai Library Network is a collaboration of libraries situated throughout Yavapai County, Arizona. The YLN facilitates the sharing of materials and resources between libraries, enabling even people in remote areas access to an extensive collection over 1 million items.

The Yavapai Library Network was initially founded in 1985, through a collaboration between the Yavapai College Library and the Prescott Public Library. Over the years the Yavapai Library Network has grown significantly and in FY2023-24 it encompassed 59 libraries, including academic, public, K-12, and special/museum libraries. The YLN also includes six special collections.



COLLECTIONS ACCESS

The Yavapai Library Network (YLN) member libraries work together by sharing both virtual and physical resources. Physical materials are transported across Yavapai County via a courier service. Once they arrive at our central hub in Prescott, they are sorted by an automated materials handler and then dispatched to the appropriate receiving libraries. This efficient process allows patrons to request materials from any member library and expect delivery within a week.



COLLABORATION

The YLN features many user groups in which members are encouraged to participate. These groups offer the chance to enhance professional skills and collaborate with others in areas such as circulation, cataloging, youth services, marketing, e-materials, and more. At times members of the user groups are called upon to provide subject matter expertise or assistance, such as when going out to RFP for YLN-wide resources.

SHARED TECH & RESOURCES

The YLN shares an integrated library system, Koha, and an online public catalog, Aspen Discovery. Member libraries have access to the Yes! Calendar, the Overdrive/Sora e-materials platform, discounted library cards, barcodes, RFID hardware and tags through Tech Logic, and tech support.







Digital Holdings - Titles




Circulation Trends

While showing an overall increase of 14.4% from FY21 to FY24, the circulation of physical materials has held steady the last two years. At the same time, digital materials continue to prove popular, with a 55.4% increase over the same four-year period.





Budget and Assessment



The current level of funding budgeted for YLN operations is \$1,047,109. This includes staffing, maintenance, subscription fees, fees associated with the sorting facility, and all other expenses. All YLN staff are now consolidated in the wages/benefits section of the above chart.

The YLN budget is fully funded by the Yavapai County Free Library District, and is separate from the reserve fund.

Assessment Formula

A reserve fund was established to ensure that YLN members enjoy leading-edge technology. The membership is billed \$200,000 annually to help support this fund

The reserve fund rolls over from year-to-year ensuring funds are available for a large reserve expenditure related to technology. Replenishing the reserve fund is the only fee that members are currently charged on an annual basis. As of June 30, 2024, this fund's balance was \$502,158. Each library's portion of this bill is determined by this detailed assessment formula.

CORE ACCESS 25%

A base amount is assessed that is the same for every library. This ensures the larger libraries are not unfairly subsidizing the smaller libraries. This functional area covers basic access to the integrated library system.

TRANSITS 25%

A major expense of the YLN is the cost of transporting materials from library to library. The formula's transit fee is based on the number of items borrowed by each library, not the number of items loaned.

STAFF 20%

The number of people accessing the integrated library system also places a burden on resources. This billing amount is determined by the number of paid staff, volunteers, and student workers performing staff functions in this system.

CIRCULATION/HOLDS 20%

The library user activity also contributes considerably to system use. The biggest portion of library user activity is circulation with the second largest portion consisting of holds. Libraries that circulate more items to their patrons pay a higher percentage of this functional area.

ITEMS/LIBRARY USERS 10%

The final functional area deals with maintaining and storing data. The number of items and the number of library users all take up space on the system. Storage space is inexpensive, which is why this functional area is the smallest percentage.

The configuration of these functional areas ensures that no single library pays more or less than its fair share. The amount billed to each member is on the next page.




